VIRTUAL DAY GUIDE

WHAT:

Virtual Day is a day that students complete their school day education totally online from home via their Oasis account on their chromebook. Class will not be held for students at Sapulpa High School for Virtual Day.

WHY:

Sapulpa High School Seniors and staff will be attending the 1st Annual Adulting 101 Senior Conference. This conference is intended to help seniors decide and maneuver through the next steps after high school and we are looking forward to offering this same opportunity for Classes of 2021 and 2022 in the future. In addition, this day will allow 10th and 11th grade students to have a practice run for potential future Snow Days and Virtual Days.

WHEN:

Thursday, November 21, 2019

HOW:

***Attendance**-attendance will be taken on a Google form via your student email. This will need to be completed on your chromebook. Once you receive the email, you will need to complete the form by 12pm-noon, Thursday, Nov. 21st.

***Assignments**-you will have an assignment in each of your seven classes. These assignments will be found on Oasis and you will need to have all seven completed by 11:59pm, Thursday, Nov. 21st. If these assignments are not completed by the deadline, a grade of 0% will be given and the assignment will not be allowed to be turned in for a late grade-it will remain the 0%.

NOTES:

- If you do not have home internet/wifi access: 1) There are several local businesses that provide free wifi (McDonald's, Sapulpa Public Library, KFC, Wal-Mart, Starbucks in Glenpool) 2) The high school campus will be open for wifi--if you choose to come to the high school to complete your virtual school day, you must report to the HS Library and are required to remain there for the entire school day (the before and after school bus schedule will run as usual and the cafeteria breakfast and lunch schedule will run as usual).
- 11th Grade Central Tech students will still need to attend their Tech classes
- 11th Grade concurrent students will still need to attend their TCC classes
